

- The first SELT (Sunrise Educational Leadership Team) Meeting was held on September 25<sup>th</sup> here at SEC. Topics on the agenda included;
  - A learning session on supporting the leadership potential of others from the new Manitoba School Leadership Framework.
  - A review of the Sunrise draft procedures related to suspension and exclusion as there are new provincial expectations in these areas.
  - An update for EY & MY principals on the divisional literacy direction for the 2024-25 school year.
  - A review for high school principals of provincial expectation for graduation and transition planning for high school students with exceptional needs.
  - An introduction to the new Provincial Teacher Collective Agreement with more learning to follow at the October SELT meeting.
  - An opportunity to share Indigenous Academic Achievement initiatives from the 2023-24 school year and time for schools to work on their 2024-25 plans in school teams or with an admin partner from another school.

A feedback form has been sent out to administrators to collect feedback on the day which will be used to help shape future SELT meetings.
