Comets bite Dawgs, lose to Fish

The Beausejour Comets split a pair of games last weekend as the Capital Region Junior Hockey League regular season winds down.

On Feb. 2, Comets league-leading scorer Nikolas Bear had two goals in a 4-0 blanking of the Arborg Ice Dawgs. With 35 points, Bear is four points ahead of Lundar's Riley Zdan in second place.

Clint Thomas and Evan Leeson added power-play goals in support of netminder Dylan Liske, who turned away 24 shots – his second shutout in consecutive games. Beausejour fired 31 pucks at the Arborg net.

On Feb. 4, the Comets travelled to Selkirk for

a matinee against the powerhouse Fishermen. The hosts took a 1-0 lead after 20 minutes on Kasen Andruschko's 16th of the year.

Clint Thomas tied it on the power play at 11:16 of the second period. His 14th goal was assisted by Zach Skiba and Tanner Amos. That 1-1 score held until late in the third period when Selkirk's Jordan Donald won it at 18:42. Skiba made 37 saves for the Comets, who took 29 shots.

The 13-13 Comets have four games remaining, with three against the top two teams. With 39 points, the Comets are in fourth place, three points behind the Lundar Falcons.

On Feb. 9, the Comets

The Pinawa Panthers are serving notice that they're on the prowl for a higher spot in the Price Division standings.

The hunt continued on Jan. 29, when the Panthers crowned the Windsor Park Royals 14-4. The Royals actually held a 2-1 lead midway through the first period, but the Panthers struck with six consecutive goals to gain a comfortable lead they would not relinquish.

All but two Panther skaters registered at least one

The Sabres found themselves down 2-0 with two minutes left in the second

period, but goals by Parker Fazio and Liam Bruchanski sent them into the third period tied 2-2. Cam Osborne gave the Sabres the lead at 15:08 of the third period, but a late Titan goal sent the game to extra hockey.

Overtime solved nothing, and Springfield won in the shootout when Taigan Newton scored in the sixth round. Sabres goalie Matt Liddett stopped all six Titan tries.

The win brought the Sabres up to .500 at 11-11, good for fifth place in the Winnipeg Free Press division and within striking distance of the fourth-place John Taylor Pipers. Springfield closes out the regular season at the Pipers on Feb. 7. They hosted the Buckeyes on Feb. 6, but results were unavailable at press time.
