UIPPER Hirst named Niverville Nighthawks head coach

Lac du Bonnet's Dwight Hirst has been named the full-time head coach of the Manitoba Junior Hockey League's Niverville Nighthawks.

Brought in in Febru-ary to pilot the struggling Niverville club on an interim bases, Hirst was recently named head coach. He joins GM Mike McAulay and assistant coach Tyler Anderson in guiding the club into the 2024-25 season this fall.

"Being the head coach of the Niverville Nighthawks in the MJHL is a surreal experience," Hirst said. "Having success within the league as a player has always been a part of what drives me to coach the next generation of players that call Niverville home.'

Hirst, 44, joined the Nighthawks in February following the dismissal of former head coach Kelvin Cech. The club had been slumping since Jan. 1 posting a 3-7-1 record

until Cech's firing Feb. 12. In six weeks, the club went 7-6 with one shoot out loss under Hirst to earn a spot in the playoffs before being knocked out by Steinbach.

A release from the Nighthawks stated when Hirst stepped in, he quickly cemented his place within the club as his immediate impact and deep understanding of the game was evident. It went on to say his ability to connect with players and inspire them to reach their full potential speaks to his coaching skills

Hirst played in the MJHL with Neepawa (96-98). He also played college hockey with Minnesota State U-Makato and the University of Manitoba. He is also a former senior hockey player for the Lac du Bonnet Blues.

He served as the head coach of the Eastman Selects U18 AAA team for four seasons.
