École Dugald unveils mural

With great anticipation, École Dugald School has unveiled a community-based mural. Located on the exterior west wall of the school, this large installation is a first for the town and a place to gather, reflect and celebrate.

The project was led by Annie Bergen, renowned Whitemouth-based mural artist who has created murals throughout Manitoba. This past winter, she skillfully worked with all Grade 5-8 students to create the design concept inspired by the school and the town. Students were also active in the drawing and painting process over a four-week period.

Measuring eight feet high by 20 feet wide, it is a huge

piece and is essentially a collage of ideas around school and town life. Incorporating academics, the fine arts, sports and culture, the city skyline in the distance, the grain elevator, and the beautiful tree in front of the school that blooms every spring, it has all been captured.

The school was fortunate to receive funding from the

Manitoba Arts Council through the Artists in Schools program. Talent development teacher Corah Enns managed the project, working directly with Bergen and the Manitoba Arts Council.

'We are delighted with the result and proud of the collective effort of the students, staff and Bergen," said Enns.
