<u>MWHSHL</u> Sabres Girls Advance

The Springfield Sabres girls advanced to the Manitoba Womens High School Hockey League semi-finals after sweeping the JH Bruns Broncos last week.

On Feb. 26, Grace Wozney made 20 saves for the shutout, while Lily Hurley and Kera Lesuk provided the firepower in a 2-0 victory. Despite only taking seven shots on goal, the Sabres made them count as Wozney stopped everything sent her way.

The Feb. 28 rematch was a back-and-forth affair that began with Alexis Campbell giving the Sabres a 1-0 lead after the first period. The Broncos tied it 1:19 in the second, but the deadlock lasted only 20 seconds before Miley Sorin scored unassisted to regain the lead for the Sabres.

It took a mere seven seconds in the third period before the Broncos tied the score again, but from there, it was all Sabres as Hurley, Bella Magura, and Journey Atamanchuk iced a 5-2 win.

Wozney was strong again, making 42 saves. Springfield took 22 shots.

Springfield faces the first-place CPET Canadiennes in the semi-finals. The Habs went 19-3 in the regular season. They led the league in goals scored and allowed the fewest against. Springfield lost all three games against the Canadiennes by 3-1, 4-2 and 4-0 scores.

Game 1 scheduled for March 4 was postponed due to weather, leaving the series opener in Oakbank on March 6 at 3:30 p.m. The series reverts to Transcona on March 8.

Sabres sniper Alexis Campbell was named Division 3 Player of the Week for the week ending Feb. 16. She was cited for three points in two games and for leading the team in scoring.

Barons Season Over

The Wolverines tried to nurse that 2-1 lead and did until late in the third period before Osborne scored unassisted with 18 seconds left. Newton scored seconds into overtime to send the Sabres to the championship.
