



Grade 9 to Grade 12 Credit Attainment Data March 19, 2024

- ✓ The data extracted from ICT was not from the end of Semester 1 for some sites so the data will be provided next meeting. The following report will give information and context to the data being shared at the April 2nd meeting.
- ✓ All students in the province of Manitoba require 30 credits in order to graduate with a high school diploma. Some credits are designated as compulsory and some are elective credits.
- ✓ Schools in Sunrise School Division have different timetables for high school students so the number of credits that they can attain in one school year differs from school to school.
Powerview, Lac du Bonnet, and Whitemouth all have 8 credits per year.
SCI had 9 credits per year and is in their second year of 10 credits per year.
ÉESS has 10 credits per year other than grade 9 where only 9 credits per year.
- ✓ The attached PowerPoint slides take a high level look at the following data:
 - Grade 9 end of semester 1 credits
 - Grade 10 end of semester 1 credits
 - Grade 11 end of semester 1 credits
 - Grade 12 end of semester 1 credits
- ✓ The first slide in each grade level contains the data for the number of credits possible for that grade level at this time at each school. The accompanying graph shows the number of students who attained a particular number of credits, organized in descending order. Students in Sunrise are exceeding the minimum requirements for credits attained at the each given grade level.
- ✓ Students who attained “zero” credits or who show up with a “blank” for number of credits may have just begun the school year with us, may be following an Individualized Program, or may have been homeschooled the past school year. Smaller number of credits attained may mean that a student transferred in or out part way through the school year. Students may also carry an “Incomplete” credit for a finite period of time and those incomplete credits won’t show up until the end of the school year.
- ✓ The division can drill further down into particular schools, grades, and individual students to assess and determine what additional supports or other assistance may need to be provided in a targeted and informed way. School administration and school student support teams meet with families on a regular basis to address needs with regards to high school credit completion. It is sometimes in the best interest, and also more widely accepted, for students to plan for a five-year or six-year high school completion target date.
- ✓ Grade 9 credit attainment data is one of the highest predictors of successful completion of high school programming and graduation.
