

# Dawson Chiropractic opens in Beausejour

A familiar face has opened up her own chiropractic practice in Beausejour.

Dr. Danika Dawson, a dedicated Doctor of Chiropractic Medicine, has opened Dawson Chiropractic Centre at 39 Third St. S. in Beausejour.

Raised in a loving family in Tyndall, she decided to open her own chiropractic practice close to home in an effort to provide personalized and community-centric care, ensuring that her fellow residents have access to high-quality chiropractic services.

“My family has been really involved in the community for a long time, so I just wanted to come back and help the people who helped me,” Dawson said. “The support has been nice. There’s even people who have never seen a chiropractor before and they reach out and see if I can help, not because I’m a chiropractor, but because it’s me. So that’s really encouraging and nice... it’s very heartwarming.”

Dawson’s journey into the world of chiropractic care was shaped by personal experiences that fuelled her passion for health care. As a teen, she faced a pivotal moment when she fell off a ladder, resulting in severe back pain. This incident not only motivated her to seek relief, but also sparked her interest in chiropractic care as a means of addressing musculoskeletal issues.

Graduating from École Edward Schreyer School in 2014, Dawson pursued higher education at the University of Manitoba, earning a Bachelor of Arts in 2018. She then enrolled in the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (CMCC) in Toronto in 2019, driven by a personal mission to help others overcome physical challenges and improve their overall well-being.

Throughout her tenure at CMCC, Dawson immersed herself in internships at St. Michael’s Hospital in downtown Toronto and the CMCC Campus Clinic. These experiences provided her with valuable hands-on training and solidified her commitment to becoming a chiropractor.

She successfully graduated from CMCC in June 2023, equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to make a positive impact on the health and well-being of her community through chiropractic care.

On top of manual adjustments at the chiropractic centre, Dawson uses diversified techniques including mobilizations, activator and deep tissue massage techniques. She is also certified in low level laser therapy, functional acupuncture and paediatric adjusting.

She said in Ontario, she and her colleagues had to take many other courses over a two-year span in order to meet their accreditation requirements.

“Chiropractic care has evolved. There are different modalities that are not really well known around here,” she said. “Now a lot of chiropractors use those types of tools.”

Dawson’s office hours are staggered to accommodate those who don’t work 9 to 5. She is open Monday and Tuesday from noon to 6 p.m., Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. (with a break from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.), Thursday and Friday from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Closed Sunday.

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## Kuczynski granted conditional use permit for home business

Springfield Coun. Andy Kuczynski was unanimously granted a conditional use permit to operate a home-based business.

Kuczynski plans to sell used passenger vehicles and motorcycles from the one-acre property on Lorne Hill Road. In a report to development officer Dan Doucet, Kuczynski said no repairs will be conducted on-site, and most sales will be online.

Council placed some restrictions on

Kuczynski. He is limited to one vehicle and one motorcycle on display, with any additional vehicles screened from public view. Only family members are allowed to sell vehicles at the site.

Doucet said Kuczynski had a business permit to sell lawn and garden equipment, but that was not renewed in 2005. He must obtain an annual license.

“I have no concerns with the proposed conditional use,” Doucet said.

The vote was 4-0. Kuczynski recused himself from voting.
