The Springfield Sabres girls opened their season with a 4-1 loss to the St. John's Ravenscourt Eagles on Oct. 15.

Sabres Drop Division Debut

A slow start and lack of discipline doomed the Springfield Sabres boys' hockey team in their first-division debut on Oct. 15, falling 8-5 to the River East Kodiaks.

The game was scoreless late in the first period when the Kodiaks fired two power-play goals 30 seconds apart, the last coming with only 37 ticks left.

Springfield halved the lead four minutes into the second period with a power-play tally of their own off Taigan Newton's stick, but the Kodiaks responded only 14 seconds later to regain the two-goal cushion.

River East scored another man-advantage goal at 9:18 to make it 4-1. Springfield mounted a comeback, scoring two goals (one on the power play) to make it 4-3. Ayden Turcotte and Kaiden Bazinet lit the lamp. The surge was stunted by another Kodiak power play goal, this one with only 40 seconds remaining in the middle frame.

The lethal Kodiak power play struck for the fifth time at 1:45 of the third to make the lead 6-3. The two teams traded goals for

the remainder of the contest, with former Eastman Selects Hayden Kochen and Can Sylvester hitting the twine for Springfield.

Springfield was outshot 40-21. Matt Lidgett took the loss. Kochen finished with four points and Bazinet three.

The Sabres were assessed 10 minor penalties, with the Kodiaks scoring five times on eight power-play chances. River East took nine penalties. Springfield scored three times on its seven opportunities.

The Sabres host Sturgeon Heights Huskies on Oct. 29 at 4 p.m. and visit the Stonewall Rams on Oct. 30.
