## CLIPPER SPORTS SCI Sabres girls look to take next step

The Springfield Sabres girls team will have a new look on the ice and behind the bench this season in hopes of building on a breakthrough 2023-24 campaign that saw them reach the MWHSHL division semi-finals.

The Sabres tied for the secondstingiest team by allowing only 47 goals in 23 games. They reeled off a 10-game winning streak and displayed more balanced scoring. Grace Wozney earned five shutouts and posted a 1.99 goals-against average and a .909 save percentage.

New head coach Evan Heinemann is a veteran MWHSHL head coach, having guided the River East Kodiaks' program for seven seasons. After two years at Springfield Middle School, Heinemann moved across the parking lot to SCI and jumped at the chance to lead the Sabres.

"I've always enjoyed being on the ice and coaching," Heinemann said.

He's encouraged by a record turnout in camp that saw more than 20 players vying for roster spots. Many of those who made the grade are young, as six Grade 9 students will suit up in 2024-25. Overall, 10 rookies are in the lineup.

"So we're young, but everyone is

working hard at practice, and it's looking very promising.," Heinemann said.

Seven veterans will be relied upon to provide leadership this season. Kera Lesuk is the captain, while the assistants are Finnley Hildebrand, Lily Hurley and Aunicka Da Silva.

"We have some great returning vets and leaders; they've been awesome on and off the ice to the new players," Heinemann said. "The girls even paired up a vet with one or two of the rookies. This goes to show what a strong foundation this program was built on."

Heinemann's game plan begins with building on speed and getting good pucks to the net. He credits the entire roster for constantly seeking improvement. Combine that effort with enthusiasm and leadership and there was plenty of optimism in the Sabres locker room in anticipation of the Oct. 15 home opener against the SJR Eagles. Results were not available at press time.

"I know we will find success by the year's end," Heinemann concluded.

The Sabres open with a three-game homestand, which also includes Oct. 17 at 3:30 p.m. against Murdoch MacKay and Oct. 22 versus the Dakota Lancers. Other teams in their division are the ESS Barons, PCI Saints and Beliveau Barracudas.

## Selects top Kenora to improve to .500

The Eastman Selects improved their record to 3-3 with a 6-3 pruning of the Kenora Thistles on Oct. 12.

Coach Bruce Sirrell's squad built a 5-0 lead six minutes into the second period that was too much for the Thistles to overcome. Josh Borgfjord's second of

the season gave Eastman an early lead at 1:24. Daniel De Gagné also scored his second four minutes later to double the score to 2-0. Calyb Moore closed out the first-period scoring with his third of the campaign at 16:38.

Two goals in 36 seconds gave the Selects a commanding 5-0 lead at

6:05 of the middle stanza. Moore and Grayson Slaney were the marksmen. While Kenora broke the goose egg at 7:09, Moore completed his hat trick at 9:29 to restore the five-goal cushion.

The Thistles scored twice in the final period but lost 6-3.

De Gagné had two points. Sam Fontaine made 28 saves for the win. The Selects fired 37 pucks at Thistle goalie Morgan Blackwood.

Moore and Noah Stott are part of a group tied for fifth in league scoring with nine points in six games. Stott's six goals tie him for third, while Moore is part of a quartet tied for fifth. Stott's six goals and nine points lead league rookies.

The Selects power play ranks sixth with a 17.2 per cent success rate. Their penalty killers are seventh-best at 82.6 per cent. Eastman has had 29 power-play chances while surrendering 23.
